Our third year participated in the project from September 25th to November 2nd. We causes and effects of climate change, dealt problem locally and globally, discussed implemented some of them in our school.

The project also cultivated in children skills cooperation, creativity, empathy, critical the ability to solve problems.



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First, we studied the greenhouse effect with experiments. Each child then created their own poster depicting the phenomenon.

Then we analyzed the causes of the phenomenon by talking about atmospheric pollution from the accumulation of carbon dioxide. With our posters we did a small protest march in the school yard to inform the school community.



We dreamed of the school of the future, as we would like it to be in our school, that is, with almost zero footprint. We split into two groups. The first group made the two-dimensional (2D) floor plan of a school and the other group made the 3-dimensional (3D) floor plan. Then each group presented their construction to the other.
