Other developments since CESU 2022

Curriculum, specifications, and subjects

- Since CESU there have been many positive changes brought in by school management. The following were brought in on timetable;
- In September 2022 school management brought in an optional Garden Design module for Leaving Cert Applied Students. The number of pupils opting for this has been high.
- In 2023/24 all of the 6th year LCA group completed this module.
- The 4th year group do a 10 week rotation of environment and social education. In addition to completion of ClimateRewrite program.

• The LCETB have over the last two years have set up a **Climate Action and Sustainability** group across all their schools and educational centres. This teams current focus is on energy.
